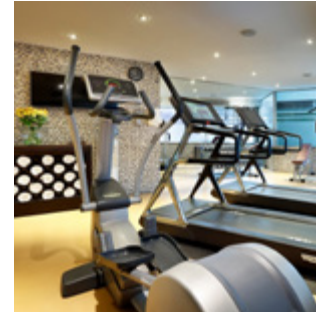
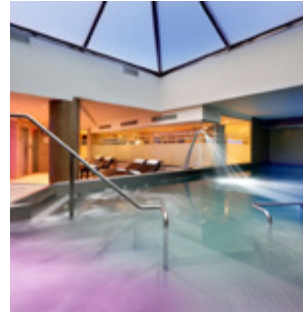


### Hilton Barcelona
