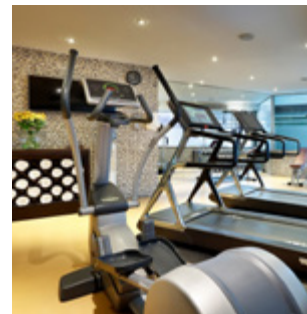
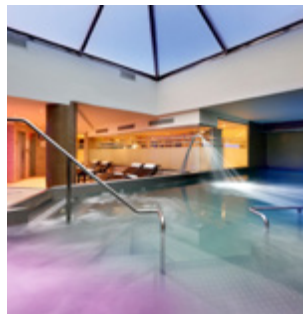


Hilton Barcelona
